

Africa's biggest eSports festival aims to create jobs

Ten countries are expected to participate in the Electronic and Video Game Festival of Abidjan (FEJA), the bigg eSport and video gaming event in Africa. Organiser, Paradise Game and official sponsor Orange Côte d'Ivoire, a putting the emphasis on job creation through the video game industry.

The Pan African qualifiers for FEJA Orange 2018 will take place between September 22 and November 22 in Côte d'Ivoire as well as in the following countries: Benin, Burkina Faso, Cameroon, Ghana, Guinea Conakry, Mali, Nigeria, Senegal, Togo. Registrations started September 12 on www.FEJA.ci.

During the three-day festival, visitors will be able to view the finals of the eSport tournaments to include FIFA, PES, Fortnit Street Fighters, Tekken, Naruto, Dragon Ball Z, Clash of Clans and Candy Crush video games.

Job creation

The aim with FEJA Orange 2018 is to promote video game industry fields and offer new perspectives to the African youth terms of employment opportunities. The theme of the FEJA Orange 2018 is, *Job Creation through the video game industr* The event will spotlight the different employment fields: game designers, developers, programmers, pro-gamers, and so or

In addition, the participants will learn about topics as diverse as creating a game, monetising a game or a mobile application Guests will also share their experience with the attendees through workshops and conferences.



Sidick Bakayoko, founder and CEO of Paradise Game, producer of the event, stated: "The video game industry is a leadil cultural industry in the world and generates nearly \$ 100 billion. Africa, despite all its creativity, represents only 1% of this industry. It is therefore crucial to promote careers in the video game industry for women and men, in order to create employment opportunities on the continent."

FEJA is also a family festival. Expos and fun activities will entertain the public, with different zones dedicated to kids, casu gamers, and retro-gamers. Guests stars (renowned eSport players, You Tubers, artists, and so on) will be part of the program.
