As a part of the prize, Kangpe will be participating at Seedstars Summit, taking place in Switzerland in March 2017. It is a weeklong training program with the opportunity to meet the other 60 winners, as well as investors and mentors from around the world. Traditionally, the final day of the Summit will be dedicated to pitching in front of audience of 1000 attendees, with the possibility of winning the US\$1 million equity investment.

Fist runner up, <u>Tuteria Company</u>, is an online platform that connects people seeking to learn anything, with those who can teach them what they want to learn came second; and the last runner-up, <u>Davtonlear</u>, is an online/cloud based video learning (E-learning) for professional certifications and courses.

Seedstars World has worked closely with Omidyar Network in order to deliver the best possible event and to provide local entrepreneurs with this opportunity.
