The ceremony took place at Kyalami's Theatre on the Track, and hosted South Africa's celebrity royalty. Ably MC'd by Vuzu's Lalla Hiyarama and Stoan Seate, it was the last word in sex-appeal and glamour. The event kicked off with a highoctane performance from dance group, Vintage Crew, in a performance tribute to local and international gay icons such as David Tlale, Wentworth Miller, Gert Johan Coetzee and Elton John.

Setting the tone for the night, the performances continued on this white-hot note, featuring Tamara Dey collaborating with rapper Reason, divas-in-training, Kelly Khumalo, Brenda Mntambo, and Thembisile Ntaka in a moving rendition of Michael Jackson's 'Earth Song."

In a cheeky nod to 'Throwback Thursday", KB Motsilanyane performed her monster hit 'Rock Lefatshe'. Vintage Crew rocked the house throughout, lending their dance skills to the performances, and ensuring that the entire event resounded of 'fabulosity'.

The winners were a mixed bag of politicians, actors, singers, and media personalities. Radio presenter Azania Mosaka took the trophy for Best Styled Female, while Diva Extraordinaire was scooped by Premier Nomvula Mokonyane. Newcomer Nomzamo Mbatha took the 'Hot Chick of the Year' Award, while her onscreen brother, Pallance Dladla won the 'Hunk of the Year' category.
