“The aim of the campaign is to support high-risk medical professionals on the frontline, dealing with infected patients and the patients themselves both through protective equipment, ventilators and other essential supplies in the quest to preserve life. Right now there is no emergency, but preparing in advance to support overburdened government health facilities is a reasonable approach in the interests of all South Africans. Hence the funds raised will be allocated as mentioned, and if we can escape unscathed, then they will still be directed to upgrading emergency services,” says Imtiaz Sooliman, founder of Gift of the Givers.

Vula Mobile joins campaign

To support the campaign, Vula Mobile, a network of over 11,000 health professionals in South Africa, has joined the campaign to help identify the areas in need of support, so that funds can be directed where they are most needed.

Since the launch of the crowdfunding campaign earlier this month, a total of R203,863.04 has already been raised with contributions from donors both locally and abroad. By supporting the campaign, donors qualify for a Section 18A tax certificate issued by Gift of the Givers.
